

Masterplan: Design Two

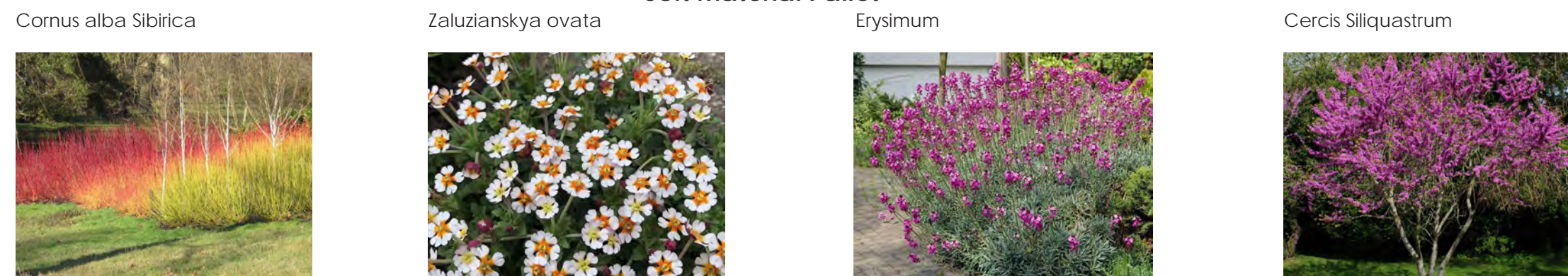

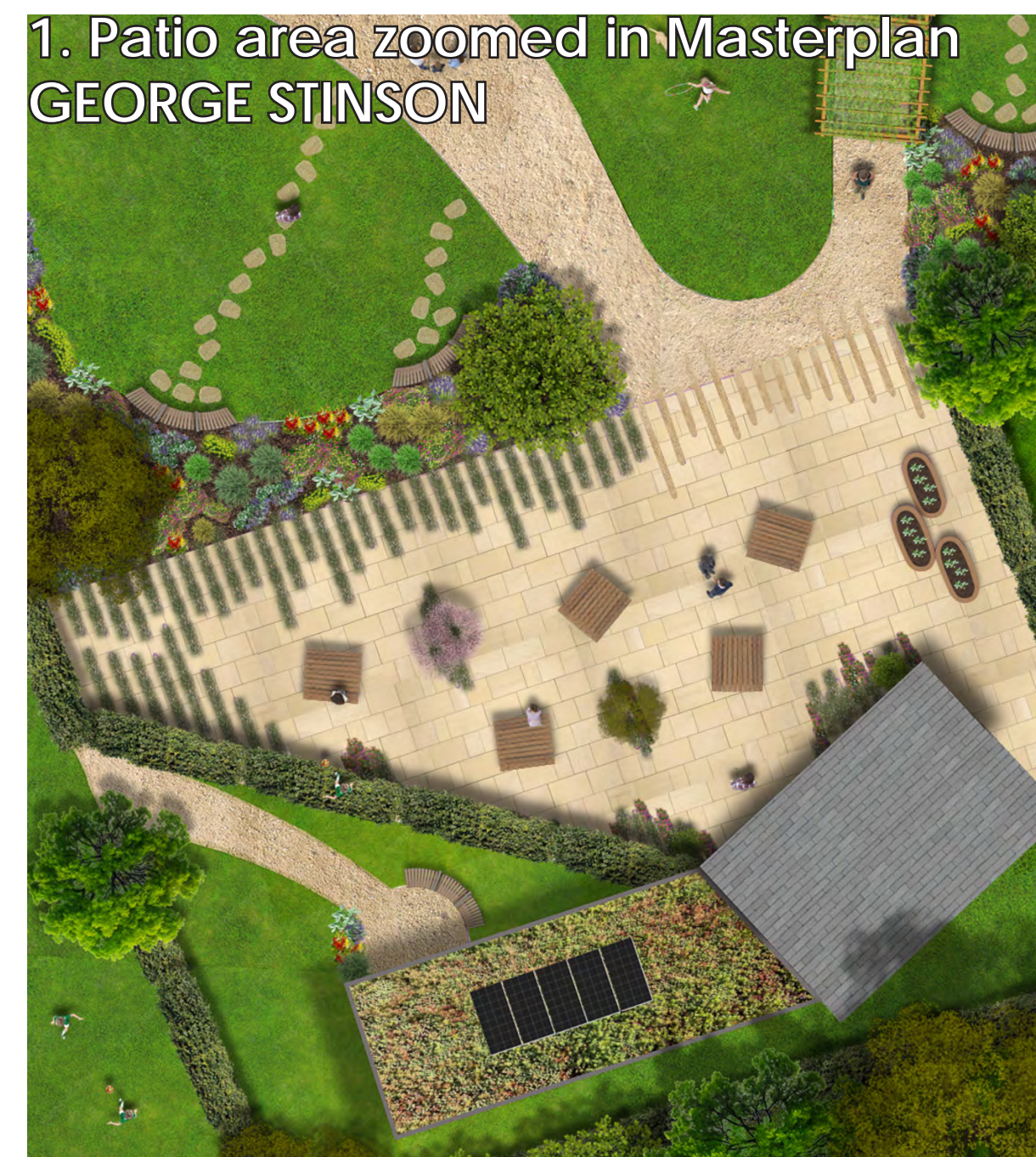
Hard Material Pallet



Soft Material Pallet



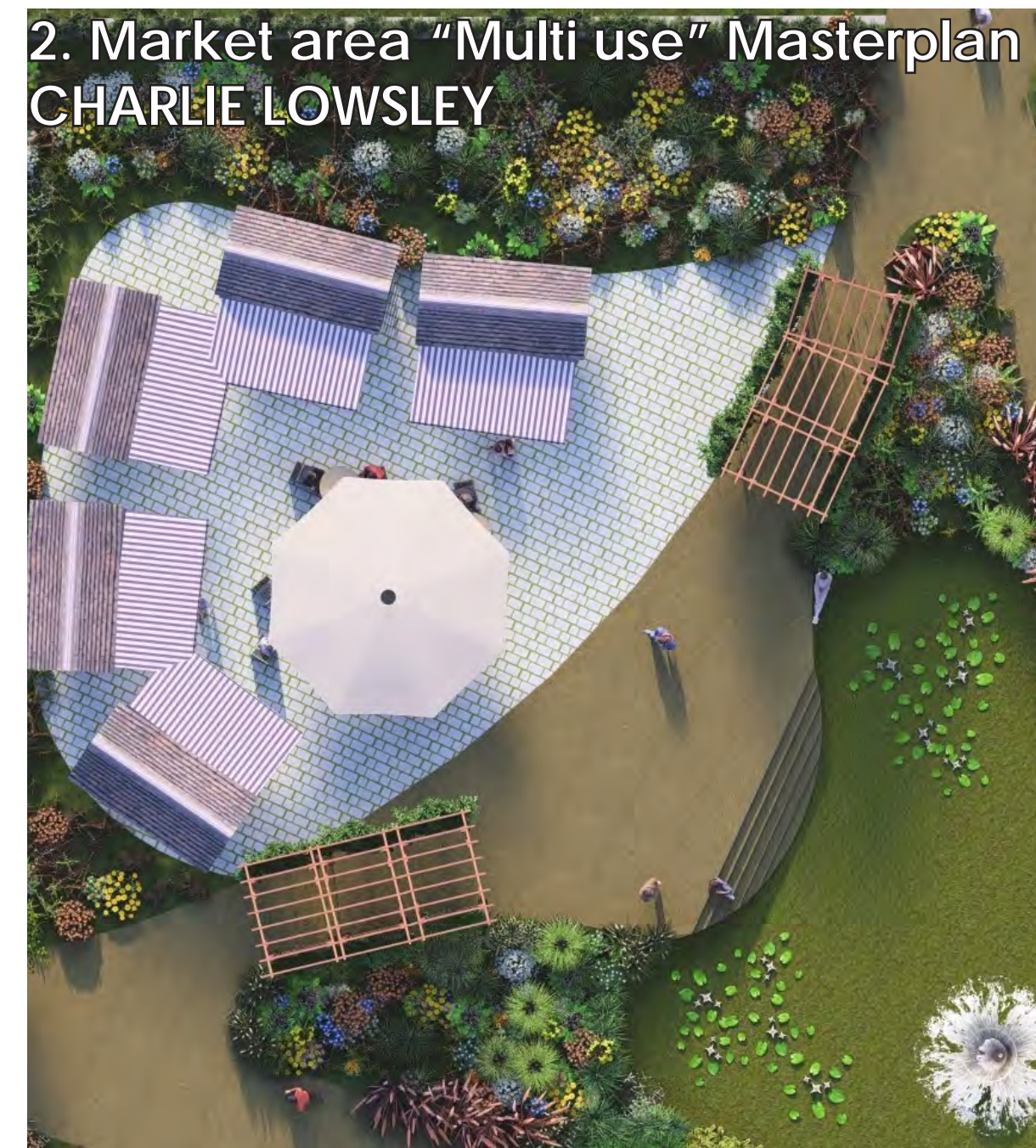
1. Patio area zoomed in Masterplan GEORGE STINSON



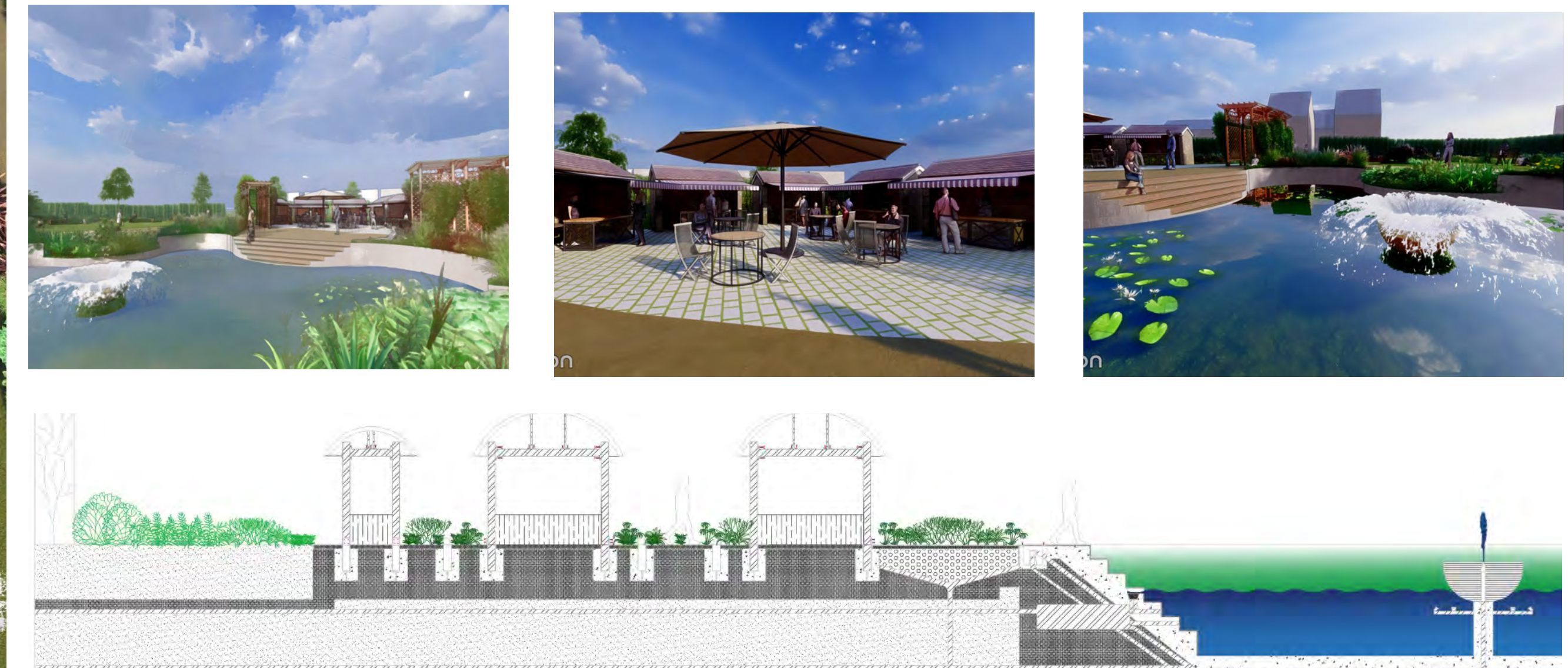
This design for the café area of our site will see the renovation and extension of the old tennis pavilion into a new café/ patio area and changing room for the community. As these ideas were thought very fondly of during our community feedback the design will foster these buildings and create new places for community members to gather, socialize, and enjoy nature. The masterplan includes a newly designed patio area with picnic tables, naturalistic planting, bug hotel and new raised vegetable beds to provide onsite produce to be sold in the café. Curved gravel paths will lead people to and from this place providing easy readability and connections to the surrounding park.



2. Market area "Multi use" Masterplan CHARLIE LOWSLEY



The multi-use area has been designed to hold a local produce market on a semi-permanent basis and to be adaptable for other structures, items, and events throughout the year. The planting is an important feature of the area with mixed British meadow mix surrounding the area providing year-round interest and ecological benefit. The pond is also an integral feature of the design allowing users to enjoy its sensory effects while also being able to interact with the water and all its inhabitants. Grasscrete and CEDEC paving allow for efficient water permeability as well as aesthetic value
