Patrols:

PC Foster reports -

I have worked Wakefield Safe Scheme today (Sunday, 28 June 2026) on a 1100 x 1500 hrs shift paying attention to Walton and Crofton.

Whilst in Walton I paid attention to Oakenshaw Lane.

Whilst at locus local pedestrians and some local drivers stopped to chat. In general they appeared happy that some Police presence was shown on the street.

PC Halloran reports –

Safe Scheme Patrol

Safe Scheme patrol conducted 16:00-17:00hrs Saturday 20th June 2026.

I conducted my patrol on a marked off-road motorbike. I came into the village from Common Lane, spending time though the village and down onto the Brooklands estate before patrolling Walton Colliery Nature Reserve. There were a few people in the park and some signs of recent offroad bikes being used on the trails. I then conducted a static observation of vehicles on Oakenshaw Lane for 30 minutes. No obvious speeding vehicles seen.

There were no calls for service whilst conducting patrols in the area.

PC Halloran reports,

safe scheme patrol conducted 15:00-16:00hrs Friday 19th June 2026. My patrol was conducted on a marked police off-road motorbike. I patrolled through the Brooklands estate before spending some time in the country park and moving down onto Oakenshaw Lane to observe vehicles on the 30mph section. There were no calls for service, and no sightings of any offroad or nuisance vehicles in the area.

PC 599 Thimm Reports

Village patrolled on Tuesday 16th June between 1900 x 2200 hrs on foot in plain clothes.

Particular attention given to fishing lakes due to warm weather, no people located fishing at all.

ASB car parks checked and no one loitering around. Passing attention to Brooklands Avenue also re drugs intelligence / electric bikes, no activity seen.

No logs came in whilst patrolling the village.

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made between 15:00 X 16:00 on 10/6 using off road motorbike. The main point of today's patrols were to target issues outside the school regarding not stopping for the zebra crossing and bad parking. The weather was particularly bad which generally means that parents try to park closer, however today there weren't really any issues. I moved one driver on to a more suitable spot after she began trying to park on a grass verge but no other issues. I didn't witness any issues at the zebra crossing and I made numerous passes through to monitor the location.

I spoke with various parents (and their children) and all were happy (as usual) to see someone monitoring the crossing.

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made on off road bike on 09/06 between 14:00 X 16:00.

We now know the address where numerous nuisance bikes (petrol and electric) are coming from. This address was monitored however occupant not home. We will be conducting a visit with VICO homes as part of our regular patrols.

The nature reserve was patrolled, as well as the waterways nearby. This was to check for any illegal fishing. Nobody fishing at all today.

The fields around Brookland Ave were all in order with no new holes dug. The stream was also checked with no obstructions.

The park near the village hall was busy however no illegal parking and nobody blocking the dropped kerb.

School time parking patrolled. Weather was pleasant which always seems to reduce any problems.

The only incident during the patrols were in relation to 2 salesmen I had spoken to in Crofton earlier that day. They had moved on from Crofton, presumably due to my presence. They did begin making their way to Walton however I continued monitoring them, and like they did in Crofton when they saw me monitoring them, they simply left the area with no further sightings.

PC 1845 Blore reports

Safe scheme carried out on Wednesday 03rd June 2026 between 15:00 x 17:00

Mobile patrol around the schools at finishing time which was busy with footfall and vehicles due to the poor weather at the time, however having said that the parking was all carried out responsibly with no concerns and the area cleared quickly.

Attention paid to Brooklands estate for nuisance bikes and the playing fields at the bottom after recent reports of damage, no new damage to the field and no sign of any bikes or kids again more than likely due to the weather being poor.

Nature reserve car park and Waterton hall patrolled both without issue the gates at the golf club seem to have had the desired effect of stopping nuisance vehicles entering the car park and the nature reserve was also quiet during the patrolled time.

There were no calls for service or incidents of note during the patrolled hours
