Crime

There have been no priority crimes this month.

Patrols:

PC Steel reports,

Patrols conducted on 27/03 between 15:00 X 16:00.

Patrols made specifically t this time on off road bike due to intelligence that a bike has been utilising the Nature Reserve illegally at this time. No signs of the bike at all today. I spoke with various dog walkers who sated they had not seen any bikes in the area for a while.

No other issues came to light whilst in the area, although a stated nearly all my patrols were focused around the nature reserve. i did spend a short time monitoring traffic along Oakenshaw Lane aswell as checking for any parking issues at the top of School Lane. No problems in either department today.

PC Foster reports,

Patrols carried out in a marked RPU vehicle on 24/03 between 10:30hrs X 13:30hrs.

Walton (3 hrs)

I have made a conscious effort to do static point checks with the Pro Laser rather than mobile roaming patrol as I normally do. I have paid attention to Shay Lane and Oakenshaw Lane and in Walton village on the descent past the parade of shops. Despite complaints to yourself in the past the speeds were pretty low. TORs were issued between 36 MPH minimum to 44 MPH maximum. I also conducted checks on Oakenshaw Lane in the new 30 MPH zone. I have achieved the following –

3 x TOR – Excess speed 30 MPH (Oakenshaw Lane)

2 x TOR – Excess speed 30 MPH (Shay Lane between Walton and Crofton)

1 x TOR – No Seatbelt

1 x TOR – Non conforming VRM

PC 1845 Blore reports,

Safe patrol carried out between 13:00 x 15:00 19/03/2026

Mobile patrol carried out around the whole parish spending time at the nature reserve, Brooklands, Walton sports and social club, Waterton hall golf course and hotel and all surrounding areas. When on Elmwood avenue I spoke to a resident after seeing his garage unattended and a large amount of electrical tools on display and visible from the road. Crime prevention advice given especially after he reported travellers in the area the previous day with tree surgeon equipment he stated they had been driving around the estate slowly but assumed that they were just looking for business. I advised that they may well have been genuine but if not they would take an opportunity of an open garage door. He was thankful for the advice and said he would be more aware of leaving the door open and unattended.

Nothing of note at the golf club but this was very busy due to the nice weather with a number of people around. Same with the hotel. I spoke to staff at both and neither reported anything of note but thanked me for showing a presence and speaking to staff.

The nature reserve was also busy but gain nothing of note reported to me. Now we are getting into the nicer weather I am sure ASB will raise its head again at the reserve but with the patrols through the winter everyone locally are aware we attend and this will hopefully have an impact throughout the summer months.

No incidents of note or reported incidents during the patrolled hours even the car parking at school pick up time was quieter with a number of parents walking to collect their children.

PC 599 THIMM Reports

Village patrolled between 1600 - 2000 hrs on 17th March 2026. I made the patrols both in an in unmarked Police vehicle, and also on foot around the village.

I visited the areas that have previously been linked to ASB such as the Premier inn and the Nature reserve. I also visited the local parks. No issues in any of these areas, with the spaces been used appropriately.

I carried out a couple of address visits which are linked to drug/ASB activity. Nothing new to report and no issues today. I will continue monitoring and targeting these addresses and linking in with VICO homes regarding any problems.

Numerous vehicles checked on via PNC and all found to be in order.

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made on 16/03 between 15:00 X 16:00. The patrol was initially going to be a patrol of Oakenshaw Lane monitoring the new speed limit, however part way through the shift I was contacted by an off duty colleague informing me of potential motorbike activity at Walton Colliery. As such I spent the remainder of my time patrolling that area. There were several fresh motorbike tracks running up the middle of the Colliery, but no bikes seen at all. I will be spending some of my regular patrols around the area as it is clear there are bikes using the location anti socially and illegally.

PC Foster Reports,

I have worked Wakefield Safe Scheme overtime at Walton today (Tuesday, 10 March 2026) between 1100 x 1500 hrs prior to my normal late turn shift. Patrol was carried out in a marked RPU vehicle.

I have achieved the following –

- 1 x TOR – Dangerous condition (Extremely heavily tinted windows, only 16% on Oakenshaw Lane)
- 1 x TOR – Excess speed (Oakenshaw Lane)
- 4 x TOR – Seatbelt
- 2 x TOR – Non conforming VRM
