Crime

There have been 0 priority crime this month in Walton.

Patrols:

PC 599 THIMM Reports,

Patrols conducted on 27th December between 1830-2230 hrs

Mobile patrols conducted in unmarked Police vehicle in hot spot areas known for ASB. There has been no reports of burglaries/car thefts so no specific vehicles or locations to monitor however as ever intelligence is aware for us to look at relating to known nominals in the area.

Car parks / local parks checked and all found to be in order, no groups of youths seen all evening.

There were a few people out on foot walking around the village but there were no issues at all.

Passing vehicles checked on PNC and all found to be in order, no logs for service whilst in the village.

Pc Steel reports,

Patrols made on 20/12 on the off road motorbike. Time of patrols was 13:00 X 16:00. I specifically wanted to patrol the school at closing time hence the patrols at this time.

I started off my patrols around Oakenshaw Lane. The roads were busier than usual and numerous vehicles checked with o issues. The only problem was an incident where several horses were been walked down the lane causing obvious traffic build up. None of the motorists committed any traffic offences but there was one vehicle which was obviously more impatient than others. He was advised of potential offences should he have attempted any sort of overtaking manoeuvre.

I then patrolled around the Nature reserve. We have had numerous complaints up until about 2 weeks ago regarding an off road bike riding around the area. The area has been patrolled by the off road bike team as part of our regular patrols, aswell as dedicated patrols on SAFE scheme.

I spoke with numerous dog walkers today, all who stated they had not seen any bikes for a long while. There were certainly no tracks to suggest a bike had been through the area. Whilst in the area a dog walker stopped me stating a car was acting suspiciously on the nature reserve having driven through the gate. I immediately attended. There was no vehicle present but I could see tracks where one had driven a short distance through the gate. The gate however was locked and secured so I am assuming that whatever vehicle it was had legitimate access.

Finally, I patrolled around the school at closing time. This was to monitor for any bad parking/illegal driving. 2 motorists were dealt with for offences of not restraining child properly, and another one of using a phone whilst driving. Several parents spoke to, to discuss parking issues but no real issues regarding parking whilst i was there (which is normally the case due to me been in uniform on a marked police bike).

PC Foster reports,

I have worked Wakefield Safe Scheme overtime this morning (18/12/2024) between 0800 x 1200 hrs in Walton prior to my normal late shift. I have paid attention to Oakenshaw Lane and School Lane.

I have achieved the following –

- 1 x TOR – Speed (Oakenshaw Lane through the village)
- 1 x TOR – Phone
- 4 x TOR – Seatbelt
- 1 x TOR – Glass not as prescribed
- 1 x TOR – Non conforming VRM

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made on off road motorbike on 12/12 between 17:00 x 18:00.

The patrol was a targeted patrol to allow me to concentrate on Oakenshaw Lane at rush hour, aswell as some of the other main roads in and out of Walton.

There were no problems at all. I spoke to several residents around Oakenshaw who did comment on the high speeds of some cars. however today the weather was very misty/damp so I think the conditions were forcing people to drive with more care.

Immediately after my SAFE scheme patrols, my regular tour of duty commenced and I was joined by a colleague also on a bike. We spent several more hours in the area concentrating on road offences but the responsible driving continued throughout the evening.

PC 1845 Blore reports

Safe scheme patrols carried out between 14:00 x 16:00 03/12/2024.

Mobile and foot patrol around the parish paying attention to the school parking and the Nature reserve.

School parking was all in order with very little disruption at pick up time. I did speak to an Amazon delivery driver who had parked inappropriately for the time of day at school pick up causing slight disruption outside the New Inn public house. Words of advice was enough to deal with the driver who understandably was busy due to the time of year and hadn't realised the slight obstruction he had made and moved the van into a more suitable position.

Nature reserve was busy with the weather being nice usual people walking dogs and enjoying the nature reserve with no issues.

Golf course patrolled but very little activity in the car park so no issues to report.

Rest of parish patrolled without incident, no calls for service during the patrolled hours.
