Crime

There have been 0 priority crimes this month.

Patrols:

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made on 04/12 between 14:00 X 16:00.

Patrols made on off road motorbike. I have been made aware of a group of bikers coming into the parish via the woods. I attended the woods which essentially separate Walton and Ryhill and found that the gates were wide open. There are works going on inside the woods and it seems the access is via these gates, which are been unlocked and left open. I spoke with one workmen to request they are closed back up so shall monitor this as this is clearly how the bikes and quads are coming into the area. The tracks on the floor confirmed this.

Elsewhere I monitored as much of the village as possible. The school was patrolled with no issues at all. The only issue traffic related was the traffic lights near Oakenshaw Lane coming into Walton. The traffic lights are causing some issues, however someone had parked on the double yellow lines causing even more problems. I located the owner of the vehicle and they then moved it which did alleviate some of the problem.

Walton nature reserve was also monitored but there were absolutely no signs of nuisance bikes whatsoever.

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made on off road motorbike on 05/12 between 14:00 X 16:00.

I initially spent some time around the school and the new "older persons" residential area (Neville Drive/Almond avenue) and specifically the allotment area. This is due to recent issues with allotment thefts across the division. Almost immediately I sighted a silver van which was creeping around the area. The van was checked out and found to be a van which contained nominals from out of our force area. They could offer no explanation as to their presence other than they were just making their way home. There were no offences so nothing I could do other than to follow them around as I believe they were potentially targeting the area. It didn't take long for them to remonstrate with me however they then left the area into Crofton and onto Doncaster Road away from the area.

I then went back into the woods connecting Walton Woods with Anglers Country Park after the issues yesterday with them been left open. Today they had been closed which obviously prevents nuisance bikes/quads entering the area.

I patrolled the school at closing time and wasn't there long before a before drove straight over the Zebra Crossing despite a parent waiting to cross. He was dealt with for this offence.

Finally, after speaking to a lady from the village I was informed the keeper of the horses on Shay Lane may well be attending his horses at that time. Whilst monitoring the school traffic I spotted the keeper drive past in his vehicle so approx 10 minutes later I attended the location where the horses were kept. I was able to record on bodycam 2 nominals tending to the horses, and then obtain their details. These have now been passed onto the council.

PC 1845 Blore reports

Safe scheme carried out Wednesday 10th December between 13:30 and 15:30

Mobile patrol around the parish streets paying attention to the Brooklands estate and surrounding streets nothing of note to report .

School were having an event and vehicles parked outside the school and surrounding area from 13:45 all vehicles on the main road were parked correctly and it appeared that people utilised the New inn pub and Walton sports and leisure club. One driver spoken to on The Grove who was going to leave their vehicle partially blocking a drive way they were advised to move it which they did without issue and thought they were not blocking it until it was pointed out.

Nature reserve was busy with people mainly dog walkers who were all in order and reported no issues when speaking to them. I then went to the golf club who are in the process of fitting an electric gate which will be up and running within a couple of days this will prevent any unwanted vehicles entering the complex. I travelled to the end of The Balk and spoke to a female dog walker who reported that she had seen a motor bike travel up The Balk and go straight ahead down the track at the end of the lane i was unable to get the vehicle down the track due to the condition of the track but there were tyre marks, i have looked on Google to see if this cuts through anywhere but it is not clear i will speak to our motor bike team to see of their knowledge is any better and to consider this as an area to patrol, She stated that it was an isolated incident and the rider didn't cause any issues. She could not describe the bike other than a motor bike but not a road bike.

No other incidents of note reported or calls for service during the patrolled hours.

PC Foster report,

I have worked Walton Safe Scheme overtime today (11/12/2025) on a 1500 x 1900 hrs shift.

Hi Viz patrols were made in a marked RPU vehicle. It was quite apparent that Walton locals are aware of the change to a 30 MPH zone on Oakenshaw Lane from the 19th as several approached me to discuss. I informed them from the 19th extra attention will be paid to the road.
